Our day started with 29 Nature Walkers watching John present some new friends he found for us before the walk. He showed us a Florida Brown Snake, a Florida Water Snake, an Eastern Garter Snake and a Eastern Glass Lizard (no legs but has eyelids and earholes, unlike a snake).

Along the trail we found these insects: an Ornate Pennant Dragonfly, a Palmetto Bug (also know as a cockroach), and an Horace Duskywing Butterfly. The plants found were Candyroot, long leaf pine cones and an bromeliad air plant called Tillandsia. Catbirds, Towhees, yellow rump warbler were heard and seen.














































As we left the South Preserve Trail one more exciting animal was found up a tree - a Coral Snake! John then proceeded to capture it in a butterfly net for all to see.
